**COMMENTS INVITED ON SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA (REGION 5)  
PUBLIC SAFETY PLAN AMENDMENT  
(GEN. DOCKET NO. 89-97)**

**Reply Date: December 26, 2000**

On April 27, 2000, we received a letter from the Southern California Regional Planning Committee proposing to amend the Region 5 Plan, which was adopted by the Commission on November 8, 1989, Order, General Docket 89-97, 4 FCC Rcd 8352 (1989) and subsequently revised by letter on November 4, 1994, 9 FCC Rcd 6716 (1994), and by Order on February 28, 1995, 10 FCC Rcd 2824 (1995). The Plan was further modified by letter on April 19, 1996 to reflect changes made during a filing window, and again by Public Notice on October 7, 1997, (Report No. WT 97-39) to assign certain frequencies to new users in Region 5. The instant plan amendment application requests modification of the frequency assignment list of the Region 5 plan.

The application requests the following changes to the frequency list:

- Channel 795 – delete Garden Grove and add Orange County
- Add Imperial Irrigation District to Channels 611, 633, 649, 669, 671, 687, 707, 709, 725, 745, 747, 763, 783 and 785.
- Add as fill-in Los Angeles County to Channels 800, 818 and 824.

In accordance with the National Public Safety Plan, each region is responsible for planning its use of public safety radio frequency spectrum in the 821-824/866-869 MHz bands.<sup>1</sup> The Public Safety Plan for Region 5 governs the use of frequency assignments in the 821-824/866-869 MHz bands within the Southern California area.

The Commission is soliciting comments from the public before taking action on this proposed plan amendment. Interested parties may file comments to the proposed amendment on or before December 7, 2000, and reply comments on or before December 26, 2000. Comments may be filed using the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS), [See Electronic Filing of Documents in Rulemaking Proceedings, 63 Fed. Reg. 24,121 (1998)], or by filing paper copies. Commenters who submit by paper should send original and five copies of comments to the Secretary, Federal Communications Commission, Washington, D.C. 20554. Commenters should clearly identify all comments and reply comments, whether submitted electronically or as paper copies, as submissions to General Docket 89-97 Southern California Public Safety Region 5. Comments filed through the ECFS can be sent as an electronic file via the Internet to <<http://www.fcc.gov/e-file/ecfs.html>>. Generally, only one copy of an electronic submission must be filed. In completing the transmittal screen, commenters should include their full name, Postal Service mailing address, and the applicable docket or rulemaking number.
